Simon Denegri is the Chair of INVOLVE in the United Kingdom. He is also the UK National Institute for Health Research (NIHR) National Director for Public Participation and Engagement in Research. His previous roles have been Chief Executive of Ovarian Cancer Action and Chief Executive of the Association of Medical Research Charities (AMRC) from 2006-2011.

His background is in campaigning and communications and has included roles such as Assistant Chief Executive and Head of Public Affairs at the Alzheimer's Society in 2002-2003 and 1992-1997 respectively. The latter coincided with the formation of the Society's Quality Research in Dementia (QRD) public involvement programme.



Carolyn J. Lukensmeyer is the Executive Director of the USA National Institute for Civil Discourse. Under Carolyn's leadership, NICD established itself as a leader in the field of democratic renewal, receiving the Search for Common Ground's 2014 Common Ground Award and leading the coalition that received IAP2's 2014 USA Project of the Year Award for Creating Community Solutions, a national dialogue on mental health.

Carolyn is the founder of AmericaSpeaks, a deliberative democracy organization that successfully applied its 21st Century Town Meeting® to a number of major public policy issues, including, state-wide health care reform in California and Maine, the national childhood obesity epidemic, disaster recovery in New Orleans after Hurricane Katrina, and the federal budget deficit.

She is the author of *Bringing Citizen Voices to the Table: A Guide for Public Managers* which provides strategies and best practices to public managers and leaders who wish to authentically engage citizens around significant policy issues.



Dr Richard Walley OAM is a Nyoongar man of the South-West regions of Western Australia within Nyoongar country.

Musician, artist, director, actor, writer, linguist, activist, educator – the extraordinary versatility of Richard Walley has seen him wear many hats over his long and illustrious career.

Richard has been awarded an Order of Australia Medal and two honorary doctorates for his contribution to the promotion of Nyoongar Culture and the Arts.

In 2010, Richard received the 'Citizen of the Year' Award in the 'Indigenous leadership' category of the WA Awards.

Richard engages in cultural advisory and education, which he carries out through his family owned company Aboriginal Productions and Promotions.

A fluent speaker of Nyungar language, a role model for Aboriginals and non-Aboriginal people alike, Richard continues to push boundaries, continually developing personally whilst always focussed on the bigger 'community' picture of Culture, Arts and Environment.
